Reinhold Fahlbeck and Barnard Johann Mulder, *Labour and Employment Law in Sweden* (Juristförlaget i Lund, 2009, 94 pages)

Can the corpus of a country's labor law be boiled down to less than a hundred pages? If the country is Sweden and if those doing the boiling are Fahlbeck and Mulder, the answer is yes: in eight sections (with numerous if equally terse subsections) devoted to the law of collective bargaining, twelve to individual employment, six to antidiscrimination, five to workers' compensation, five to dispute resolution, and one to sanctions and remedies. For the student, teacher, or practicing lawyer who needs quickly to know the lay of the legal terrain—akin to the billboard one encounters entering a park that points an arrow and announces, “You Are Here”—this is it.
